Calgary Philharmonic brings holiday favourites and a heartwarming collaboration to your home this December

Calgary Alta. (Nov. 17, 2020) - The Calgary Philharmonic will be filling homes with the sound and spirit of the season at a free virtual concert on Saturday, December 12 featuring holiday music and a heartwarming collaboration to benefit The Mustard Seed.

People can sing along to familiar favourites they know and love — Jingle Bells, Deck the Halls, Joy to the World, Sleigh Ride, and more — and enjoy Arcangelo Corelli's classic Christmas Concerto performed by Calgary Phil musicians online. The concert will also showcase Mittens, a new work performed with vocalist Ellen Doty, who is originally from Calgary and now lives in Edmonton. Doty co-wrote the song with Wyatt C. Louis, a Plains Cree folk singer-songwriter based in Moh'kinstsis Treaty 7 Territory, for her fourth annual holiday giveback campaign. For the month of December, \$5 from every bag of Mittens Coffee sold at Monogram Coffee, and proceeds from sales of a limited edition coffee ice cream from Made by Marcus, will go to The Mustard Seed in support of its efforts to eliminate homelessness and reduce poverty. The Calgary Phil will also make a donation to the not-for-profit organization and encourage others to do the same.

"We know it's been a tough year for a lot of people — we hope this concert will spread some holiday cheer and also help provide some much-needed support to those who are facing the additional challenges of homelessness and poverty," says Paul Dornian, President and CEO of the Calgary Philharmonic. "We welcome the chance to be part of this joint effort to give back to the community."

The concert is part of the Calgary Phil's free online fall series. Following a two-week break, the series resumes this Saturday, November 21 and includes the Canadian debut of a work by American composer Frank Ticheli created in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. A new concert video premieres every Saturday at 7:30 p.m. (MDT) through to December 19, 2020. Viewers can register in advance for free at calgaryphil.com.

The performances remain available on the website for one month following each premiere to give as many people as possible a chance to enjoy them. Plans are also in the works for another series of online concerts in the new year.
